



## Navigating Your MERIT-BASED SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

There are hundreds of thousands of dollars in scholarships awarded by the Delta Gamma Foundation each year! Undergraduate members can apply for merit-based scholarships. Applications are open from December 1 to March 1 and can be found under the Foundation > Applications tab on the Delta Gamma website. ### 1. Check that you're eligible.

Merit-based undergraduate scholarship applicants for the 2022-2023 academic year must:

- be an initiated member of Delta Gamma by 12/31/2022.
- be a full-time student for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 academic years.
- have a cumulative GPA of B (the equivalent of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale) or higher.

### 2. Review the Instruction guide.

The Merit-Based Scholarship Application Guide is located in the Delta Gamma [website library](#). It will help you with the application process and answer any questions you may have.

### 3. Create a ridiculously great resume!

Creating a resume is required for the application, but it is also a great start to your professional success once you graduate.

### 4. Gather your transcripts.

Make sure you have transcripts (official or unofficial) from all of the universities you have attended.

### 5. Complete the online application.

To complete the application, you must create a SmarterSelect account.

Make sure you give yourself plenty of time to complete the application. There are two essays and some additional information you will need to compile.

### 6. Inform your ATC once you apply.

Let your Advisory Team Chairman (ATC) know you're applying and they should be expecting a recommendation link. The recommendation must be submitted before March 15.

### 7. Finalize your application.

Don't forget to double check all of your materials before submitting your application.

### 8. Click submit by March 1!
