



Photo Tips for Alumnae

This photo guide is intended to help alumnae in taking good photographs with the intention of sending them to Executive Offices for possible future use.

PHOTO TIPS AND TRICKS

- Make sure that your photograph has good lighting. In other words, the photo should be bright so that faces and other important details in the photo can be seen.
- The angles in the photo should be head-on so that faces are visible.
- Refrain from using filters to alter the colors or lighting in the photo.
- If the picture is a close-up of one person or a small group of 2-3 people, try using portrait mode on your smartphone to focus on those in the photograph.

Below are some examples of great alumnae photos for reference:



Example 1: This photo is an amazing example of good lighting, angles and no filter. Additionally, all of the faces in the photo are very visible.

Example 2 (left): This close-up picture is a great example of good lighting, a front facing angle and a lack of filters.

Example 3 (below): This photo is a good example of not using filters and focusing the photo so that all faces in the picture are visible.



Example 4 (left): This close-up picture is a great example of good lighting and focus. This photo is also a good example of an appropriate time to use portrait mode.
