Fraternity Standards Knowledge Check for CMT Officers





Overview

Congratulations on being elected as a CMT officer!

Now that you have all learned more about the Fraternity Standards for Collegiate Chapters and your specific officer roles and responsibilities at training events, it is time to come together as a CMT to apply what you've learned to your specific chapter.

This activity will help you see where your chapter excels and where you want to focus on improvement to align with the Fraternity Standards. After this activity, you will have a plan that you share with others who can help you put your ideas into action.



The Fraternity Standards for Collegiate Chapters are grouped into the following seven categories:

- Chapter Culture
- 2. Health, Well-Being & Member Safety
- 3. Honor Board
- 4. Operations
- 5. Finance
- 6. Recruitment
- 7. Community

Activity

Step 1

As a CMT, discuss these seven categories and then agree on two areas where your chapter currently excels. Explain why you chose these two categories and give examples of what you already do well in these areas.

Step 2

Now, thinking of the categories, choose two your chapter could improve on.

- · Why did you choose these two categories?
- Who on CMT is responsible for these two categories that you chose? It could be multiple officers or just one.
- Who outside of CMT is a resource you can get help from in each of these two categories? It could be specific advisers, your regional team contacts, your collegiate development specialist (CDS), your Fraternity/Sorority advisor, your chapter members and so on.

Step 3

Under each category, select one specific Standard you identified as one you can improve upon.

Step 4

For each of the two Standards you have selected, come up with one idea to work on during 2024 while you are all in office together. The goal is to improve your chapter's performance on this Standard by the end of your terms in office. List which specific Standard under which category you are addressing, what you plan to do, who will do it and by when.

For example, if you choose to work on Standard 1 under the Operations category: CMT officers work together, brainstorm solutions, collaborate with the directors they support (if applicable) and their advisers and meet on a weekly basis.

Identify which areas under this Standard you want to improve upon and then agree on a concrete plan for how to do it.

Step 5

Send your plan to your advisory team chair (ATC) and anyone else you listed as a resource by March 1. Delta Gamma Fraternity wants to support every chapter to meet or exceed all the Collegiate Standards and your advisers and regional team officers want to help you enact your plans to make your chapter stronger than before you took office!
