Frequently Asked Questions

Registration

What is Anchor Academy?

- Anchor Academy is a personal and professional development event that equips collegiate chapter leaders with skills to succeed in their Delta Gamma positions and beyond. Anchor Academy provides personal, professional and leadership development training to benefit your time in your position and beyond.
- Anchor Academy is NOT officer position training. However, you will leave Anchor Academy with a new network of other Delta Gamma leaders and skills to be successful in your role.

Where can I register to attend Anchor Academy?

- Register via [this link](#). The deadline to register is January 3, 2025.

Who attends Anchor Academy 2025?

- In 2025, Anchor Academy includes tracks for the following representatives from each collegiate chapter: vice president: communications, vice president: member education, vice president: programming, vice president: Foundation and advisory team chair (ATC). All collegiate chapters are expected to send attendees for each of these roles to their assigned Anchor Academy session.

I am one of required Anchor Academy attendees for my chapter, but I am unable to attend.

- Email dgevents@deltagamma.org to complete a waiver. You will be responsible for identifying an alternate member to attend your track (i.e. another member of CMT, JCMT or the advisory board)

My collegiate chapter has a conflict that prohibits any of us from attending (i.e. participating in primary recruitment, etc.). What should we do?

- Email dgevents@deltagamma.org for options on attending an alternate session.

I need to arrive to Anchor Academy late or leave the event early. What should I do?

- Anchor Academy is an institute style experience and attending the event in its entirety is critical. Contact dgevents@deltagamma.org to see if your plans are approved or we recommend you find an alternate to attend the event on your behalf.

I registered for Anchor Academy and am no longer able to attend. What should I do?

- Please notify dgevents@deltagamma.org as soon as possible. If you cancel your plans to attend the event less than 10-days before your session start date without an approved absence excuse (illness, family emergency, etc.) you or your chapter may be held responsible for the cost of travel, accommodation, etc.

Cost to Attend

Who pays for Anchor Academy?

- In 2025, all costs associated with Anchor Academy (cost of attendance, travel, hotel, etc.) are covered by Delta Gamma Fraternity and Delta Gamma Foundation. There are no additional costs to the individual or collegiate chapter.

How will I receive reimbursement for travel related expenses?

- Specific instructions for reimbursement for travel related expenses (i.e. baggage fees, transportation to airport, travel day meal, etc.) will be provided prior to your event session. Collegiate chapters are encouraged to utilize chapter purchase cards for these costs and submit one expense report to Delta Gamma.

Travel

How do I book my flight for Anchor Academy?

- You will receive instructions to book your flight after registering for Anchor Academy. All flights must be booked via Delta Gamma's preferred travel agent. **The deadline to book flights is January 10, 2025.**
- Flight booking instructions:

 - Your school/chapter
 - Your full name as it appears on your identification
 - Date of birth
 - The city/airport you will be traveling in and out of
 - Preference of window or aisle seat
 - Please note that flights should be booked to accommodate the following arrival and departure times:
 - Denver session:
 - Arrive on Friday, January 31 by 4 p.m. MT
 - Depart on Sunday, February 2 after 3 p.m. MT
 - Columbus session:
 - Arrive on Friday, February 14 by 4 p.m. ET
 - Depart on Sunday, February 16 after 3 p.m. ET
 - Charlotte session:
 - Arrive on Friday, February 21 by 4 p.m. ET
 - Depart on Sunday, February 23 after 3 p.m. ET
- Debbie will respond with flight options for you to confirm and approve
- After approving your flight, Debbie will book and it will be charged directly to DG.

How will I be reimbursed if I choose to drive to Anchor Academy?

- If you are in a drivable distance to your Anchor Academy session, you are encouraged to rent a car to be fully covered by Delta Gamma insurance. Cost of rental cars will be reimbursed by Delta Gamma.
- Email dgevents@deltagamma.org for more information and access to Delta Gamma's corporate code that allows for vehicles to be rented to drivers under the age of 25.
- If you choose to forfeit insurance and drive your own vehicle, you will be reimbursed at the mileage rate of \$0.50/mile. Instructions on submitting this expense report will be shared prior to your event.

When do I need to arrive to my Anchor Academy session? When will I depart?

- All Anchor Academy attendees should book travel to arrive on the Friday of their assigned session by 4 p.m. local time.
- Departure flights should be booked to leave on the Sunday of your assigned session after 3 p.m. local time.

Accommodations

Do I need to book my hotel room for Anchor Academy?

- No. All hotel rooms will be booked on your behalf.

Who will I be rooming with?

- Collegiate Attendees: Two double-occupancy hotel rooms will be booked for collegians for each collegiate chapter. You will be rooming with members from your chapter. By default, collegians registered for the vp: communications track will be assigned a room with the collegian registered for the vp: member education track. Collegians registered for the vp: programming track will be assigned a room with the attendee registered for the vp: Foundation track.
- Adviser Attendees: All advisers will stay in a double-occupancy hotel room and will be assigned to room with another adviser attending Anchor Academy. You will be notified of who your assigned roommate is via email prior to attending the event.

I have medical accommodations that require a single room. How can I request one?

I am local to my assigned session, do I need to stay in the provided hotel accommodations?

- Yes. All attendees, regardless of chapter distance to the assigned Anchor Academy session location are required to stay at the hotel.
