Who is Delta Gamma?

Delta Gamma is one of the largest National Panhellenic Conference organizations with a mission to do good. We offer a welcoming environment for women of diverse backgrounds, where they can build lifelong friendships, support one another's growth and make a positive impact on the world around them.

How is this process different from primary recruitment?

The establishment process is different from primary recruitment because you are only meeting with Delta Gamma. Because it's a time only Delta Gamma recruits, we get to be a bit more casual and have more time to build relationships. Delta Gamma's establishment process will involve the opportunity to meet individually with members through the meet ups, and then the process continues with invitationonly Preference and Bid Day events.

What will the recruitment process for DG look like?

Our recruitment process will begin after Panhellenic Bid Day. You will find our consultants tabling around campus and hosting events and meet ups for women to learn more about DG and what it means to be part of a new chapter. Those interested will need to sign up for meet ups with one of our establishment team members.

When will DG have Bid Day?

Our Bid Day will occur on February 8 following our preference events.

Will Delta Gamma have a suite space?

Yes, Delta Gamma will be taking over our original suite space with brand new furniture and other renovations. We can't wait for our members to enjoy the brand new space this semester!

Will DG be participating in primary recruitment?

DG will participate in all rounds of primary recruitment beginning in spring 2026.

If I participated in formal recruitment, can I still be considered by Delta Gamma?

Yes! Unless you currently have a bid from another chapter, you are eligible to participate in Delta Gamma's recruitment.

What is the difference between a new chapter and a chapter?

A new chapter is a Delta Gamma chapter just getting started at a school. It's an exciting time when members have the chance to build traditions, shape the chapter's culture, and bring fresh energy and ideas to the Panhellenic community. A chapter, on the other hand, refers to an existing group that already has its own traditions and established presence.

What is the establishment timeline?

We have several info sessions leading up to our final establishment week. You can find information on those on our Instagram (@miamideltagamma). Info sessions are optional, but highly encouraged. Following these sessions, we will hold meet ups from February 5-7. Attendance is required to be considered for membership. We'll hold an inviteonly preference event and bid day celebration on February 8.

What support will the chapter receive?

We will have two stationed consultants along with the support of a local advisory team, regional volunteer team and full-time staff members at Executive Offices. CDC Maddie and CDC Madden are so excited to be in Miami!

How are big and little sister pairings assigned in a new chapter?

Delta Gamma will provide a "twin sister" pairing to all new members - this is the foundation for the future big/little process. Having a twin will allow members to create the close bonds that are often formed between a big and little.

What leadership opportunities are available?

Many leadership opportunities will present themselves to members of Delta Gamma. These can include being elected to our chapter management team, a director position and various other opportunities. Before officer elections, all members will be placed on committees and members will have the option of electing to serve on a subcommittee with more responsibilities.

Will DG be hosting events/socials with other organizations?

Yes! We know connecting with other students on campus is an important aspect of college life. We have been connecting with other organizations to collaborate with throughout the year to help build relationships with the rest of the community.

How will officers be elected?

Officers will be elected based on an application process, interview process with consultants and then endorsed with a vote by new chapter members. We will elect our first set of officers this spring, after Initiation and Installation.

What is the time commitment for new chapter members?

New chapter members are expected to attend one meeting a week where we will cover business items and new member education. We will also have opportunities throughout the semester to build connections and make lasting memories with DG sisters. A detailed schedule will be provided on Bid Day so that new members can know what to expect throughout the semester.

Where will DG do their service events/ philanthropic events?

Our philanthropy, Service for Sight, provides aid to the blind and visually impaired community. We've had a longstanding relationship with the Miami Lighthouse for the Blind and we are so excited to continue to strengthen this partnership to provide members the opportunity to do good. We can't wait to bring back our major fundraiser, Anchor Splash, to Miami's campus. Back in 1966, our chapter here hosted the first ever Anchor Splash that went on to become one of the most recognized philanthropic events across the United States.

Are there alumnae/advisers that will support the chapter?

Yes, our alumnae are excited and eager to be involved and support the chapter. We have over 1,000 members in the Miami alumnae chapter to help, and many more nearby. The chapter will also receive the support from an advisory team that will receive specialized training and resources.

Why did DG leave Miami?

Our Beta Tau chapter was closed in 2018, due to safety concerns and risk-management concerns. We have maintained a strong partnership with the university since closing, and feel confident that this will be a great time to return to campus.

How many women are you taking?

We are looking to recruit a whole chapter – women of all class ranks and backgrounds. We are limited to recruiting up to Panhellenic Total which is set after primary recruitment so we encourage you to connect with us if you're interested!

What is Delta Gamma looking for in members?

We are looking to recruit women who will contribute to a supportive and inclusive sisterhood. Our chapter will be full of members who are dedicated to making a positive impact on their communities, act with integrity, are academically driven and have diverse passions.

What will Delta Gamma's new member process look like?

We intentionally design the introduction to our sisterhood that covers different themes over a five week period. Our focus is to create a warm and welcoming space where new members can truly connect with Delta Gamma and with each other. Topics range from identifying values, making connections, appreciating the impact of philanthropy and more.

What makes Delta Gamma different from other sororities?

Delta Gamma stands out because of our strong sisterhood, empowering women and making a real impact on campus and beyond. We focus on building lifelong friendships, supporting each other and creating meaningful experiences.

What are the requirements to join and maintain membership?

To join and maintain membership, you must be enrolled full-time as a student, meet our GPA minimum, pay required dues/fees and not be a member of another NPC group.

How much does it cost to join?

Chapter dues will be about the average amount of other Panhellenic groups. Come join one of our info sessions or meet ups where we will share a full breakdown of dues and payment options.
